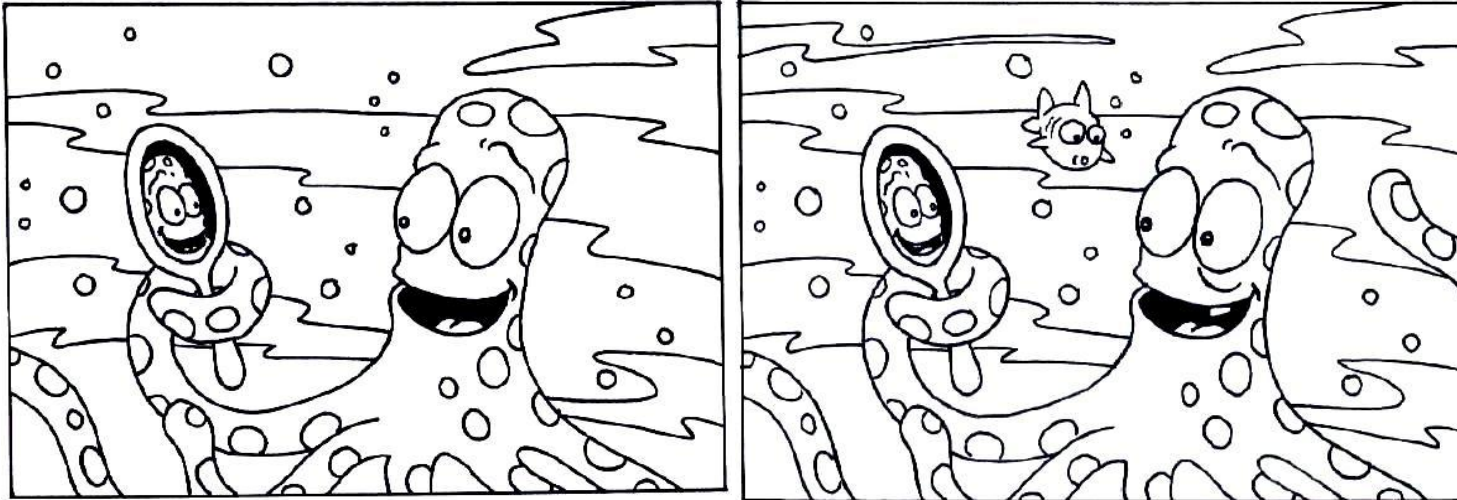
Alphabet Signs!!

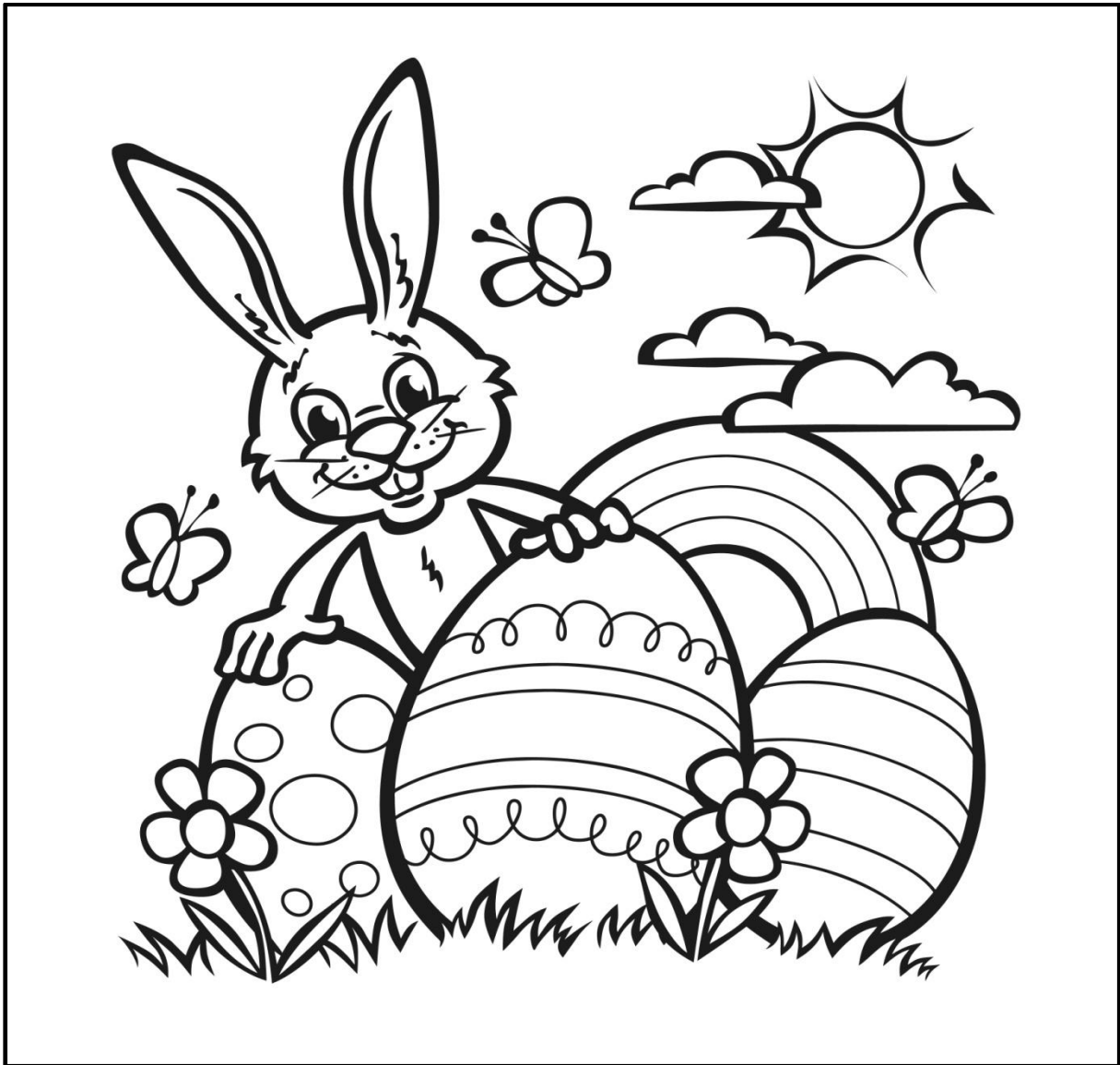

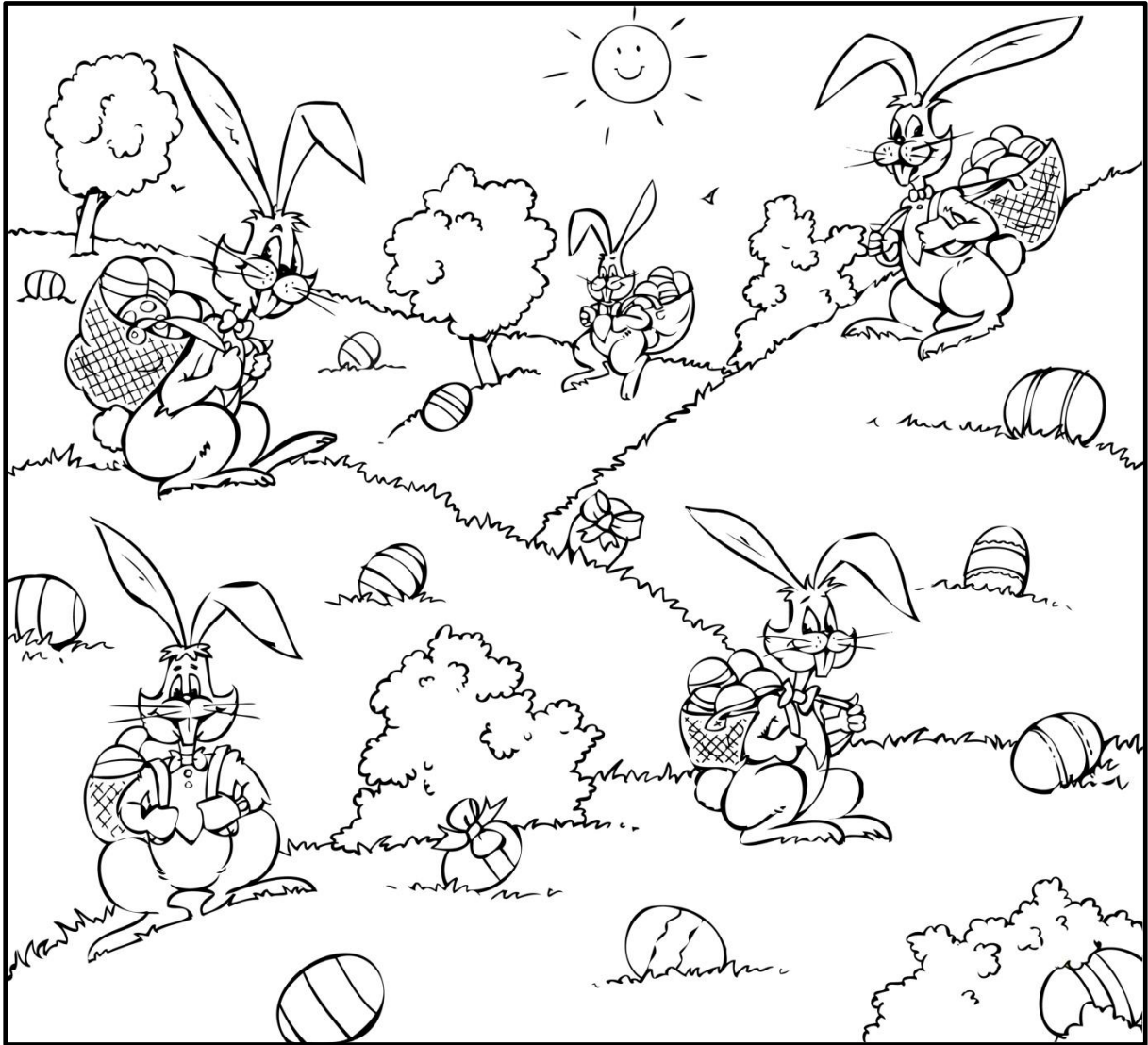
